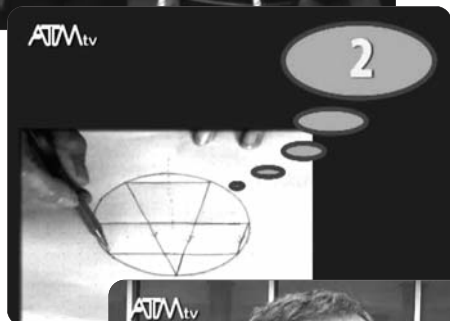
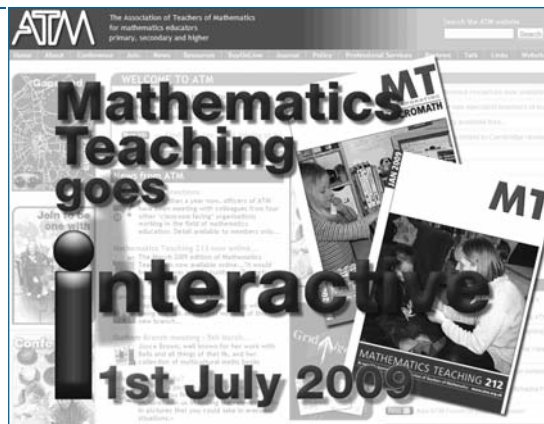


MTi
